Location: 4 miles West and 2 1/2 miles South of Columbus, KS HWY 7/69/160 intersection

Trap at Sportsmen's Pit, Columbus, KS

Location: 7 miles West and 4 1/2 miles North of Columbus, Kansas HWY 7/69/160 Intersection

- This match is certified as a State Qualifier, and State Match qualifier rules will be followed
- Both Trap and Skeet qualifications will be available.
- Please call Bob Shanks at (620) 674-1675 to pre-register. Registration forms and payment are due the day of the shoot. Registration will begin at 9 a.m. Shooting will begin at 10:00 a.m.
- There will be a \$15.00 fee for each participant per discipline. Checks should be made payable to Cherokee County 4-H Shooting Sports.
- Contestants must have received instruction in their home county 4-H Shooting Sports Program and meet the 4-H age requirements for the state contest.

NOTE: The minimum age to participate at the State Match is 10 years old before January 1, 2025.

- Contestants must bring their own shotgun, shells, and protective gear.
- NO RELOADS Allowed. NEW SHELLS, no larger than 12 gauge.

Juniors/Intermediate: 4-H Age 10-13 before January 1, 2025
Seniors: 4-H Age 14-18 before January 1, 2025

Trap qualifying score: 35 to 50 from the 16-yard line
Skeet qualifying score: 30 of 50 possible

No Concessions will be available on site. No awards will be given.
